Logistics and Transportation Educational Program for Pilot Project

(Wilkes-Barre, PA) – A dynamic series of educational programs have been arranged for companies in the Logistics and Transportation industry focusing on employee development and business growth.

Penn State University, Wilkes-Barre Campus and Luzerne County Community College are pleased to present the following educational opportunities in collaboration with the Northeast PA Logistics & Transportation Industry Partnership. These programs are open to employees of any company in our community and are also open to individuals from the public sector.

Both new and existing supervisors will benefit from the Supervision Essentials course, composed of 16 three-hour training sessions. Participants will earn a certificate from Penn State University in Supervision Essential and can opt to take a final exam for three undergraduate credits in Supervisory Management.

Customer service professionals interested in learning skills in communicating and dealing effectively with internal and external customers will benefit from the Customer Relations Program. Participants earn five undergraduate credits for the first three courses and an additional six credits for the following two courses. An 11 credit undergraduate certificate in Customer Relations is awarded upon successful completion.

An overview of Supply Chain Management is a short ten hour course which provides an overview of the logistics and transportation in addition to a basic understanding of supply chain management.

Warehouse Management Distribution is a 30 credit program that prepares the career orientated individual with the entry-level skills necessary to succeed as a business professional in the Warehousing and Distribution Industry.

The Diesel Mechanic Technician Training Program has been uniquely developed to address the demand for highly skilled Diesel Engine Mechanics. New and experienced diesel engine mechanics will benefit from increasing their skills in this hands-on program.
